School Context and Background

Sperrin Integrated College is a co-educational, all ability grant maintained integrated College located on the outskirts of Magherafelt. The College was established in 2002 following parental demand for integrated education in the Mid-Ulster and surrounding districts. Sperrin College educates pupils from all traditions and abilities in a caring environment where there are respectful working relationships at all levels.

The school strives to promote equality of opportunity for all pupils, a desire for learning and encourage partnerships with parents, to ensure all pupils reach their full potential. The approach to learning focusses on pupils developing the necessary dispositions required to pursue educational excellence; therefore, the College motto is **'Pursuing Excellence Together'**.

The integrated ethos is an integral part of the College life and permeates all aspects of the school. The College currently has an approved admissions number of 100 and an enrolment number of 542. The school now has a significant level of oversubscription. The intake of the school reflects the truly integrated nature of Sperrin College with a religious balance of 36.72% Protestant, 45.39% Catholic and 17.9% other, of the pupil population. The religious balance is also reflected in the governance, leadership team, and staff at Sperrin.

Integrated education at Sperrin College offers the pupils an enriching experience by providing them with opportunities to develop not only their own cultural identity but to share and learn from their peers. The pupils develop a deep understanding of the richness of cultural and religious diversity by working alongside, in the same school, those of different views and faiths. They are provided, within the curriculum and the extra-curricular programme, opportunities that cultivate their understanding of themselves and others. The pupils develop confidence and self-worth and have respectful attitudes to others.

The curriculum of the school and learning experience, engages pupils by making relevant connections to teenage life and the world of work. Assessment for and of learning, rests at the heart of what Sperrin Integrated College does and is crucial in helping the staff move the pupils forward in their learning. In evaluating the learning experience, the staff utilise the pupil and parent voice. This ensures the curriculum is fresh and relevant to all the learners' needs and the needs of the economy.

The staff of the school continuously develop their skills to respond to the ever-changing landscape of education. The college provides a stimulating learning environment where academic study and intellectual pursuits are cherished and valued. The College recognises and develops the unique potential of each individual pupil ensuring that stretch and challenge is coupled with the necessary support. This in turn enables the pupils to become questioning, independent, reflective young people who can appropriately use their knowledge to understand, interpret and interact with today's society.

Principal's Forward

The academic year of 2019-20 could be described as unprecedented both in wider societal terms and within our school community.

In August 2019 ,following on from our successful School Development Proposal, the Year started very much as normal ,with yet another record breaking set of academic results and a significant increase in our intake ,with the enrolment of 109 pupils into Year 8 ,however, by early February 2020 it became clear that the remainder of the academic year was going to be impacted by the emerging COVID-19 global pandemic.

In March 2020 ,following a Ministerial directive from Peter Weir, Minister for Education ,MLA, Sperrin College, like all schools in Northern Ireland closed to most pupils . Teaching staff and pupils quickly moved to online ‘Remote Learning’ using the ‘Google classroom’ platform.

The school initially opened to facilitate the supervision of a very small number of Key workers children, however, in the latter part of March ,Sperrin College staff joined the ‘Magherafelt Key Worker Hub’ based at Magherafelt Primary School and supervised key worker children from six different primary schools one other post-primary schools and our own key worker children on a rotational basis.

Following the government announcement cancelling formal examinations, teachers engaged in a significant body of work, providing Centre Assessed Grades to CCEA and the other examination Boards to enable pupils to achieve outcomes for progression to university and Sixth form.

In June ,all staff (Teaching and Non-Teaching) returned to school to plan and prepare for reopening the College to pupils in August 2020.A huge amount of work was carried out by the entire staff to prepare for teaching and learning under COVID-19 restrictions and in readiness for an early term start date of 17th August 2020.

In an ordinary year, it is very much my role as Headteacher ,to acknowledge the work the whole school community does that contributes to the success of Sperrin College. However , in times of adversity, this is when we see the truly inspiring team of teachers and Non-Teaching staff we have in our school. Teachers and teaching assistants ,caretaking staff, technical support ,cleaners and administrative staff all worked tirelessly ,together, to ensure our pupils and their parents had some semblance of certainty in very uncertain times and that the education and welfare of our pupils continued during the most difficult phase in the school’s history.

I want to acknowledge the enormous contribution made by the Board of Governors and the Senior Leadership team throughout this very challenging period. I also want to recognise the contribution the other senior staff ,who joined the senior team on numerous occasions throughout lockdown to plan ,offer expertise ,guidance and helped steer the way ahead ,all ‘Pursuing Excellence Together’.

Finally ,I want to thank the parents and pupils who have simply been wonderful ,patient and supportive. Whilst we were parted ,we were very much together in spirit. Thank you.
