School Context and Background

Sperrin Integrated College is a co-educational, all ability grant maintained integrated College located on the outskirts of Magherafelt. The College was established in 2002 following parental demand for integrated education in the Mid-Ulster and surrounding districts. Sperrin College educates pupils from all traditions and abilities in a caring environment where there are respectful working relationships at all levels.

The school strives to promote equality of opportunity for all pupils, a desire for learning and encourage partnerships with parents, to ensure all pupils reach their full potential. The approach to learning focusses on pupils developing the necessary dispositions required to pursue educational excellence; therefore, the College motto is **'Pursuing Excellence Together'**.

The integrated ethos is an integral part of the College life and permeates all aspects of the school. The College currently has an approved admissions number of 100 and an enrolment number of 594. The school now has a significant level of oversubscription. The intake of the school reflects the truly integrated nature of Sperrin College with a religious balance of 30.47% Protestant, 48.32% Catholic and 21.21% other of the pupil population. The religious balance is also reflected in the governance, leadership team, and staff at Sperrin.

Integrated education at Sperrin College offers the pupils an enriching experience by providing them with opportunities to develop not only their own cultural identity but to share and learn from their peers. The pupils develop a deep understanding of the richness of cultural and religious diversity by working alongside, in the same school, those of different views and faiths. They are provided, within the curriculum and the extra-curricular programme, opportunities that cultivate their understanding of themselves and others. The pupils develop confidence and self-worth and have respectful attitudes to others.

The curriculum of the school and learning experience, engages pupils by making relevant connections to teenage life and the world of work. Assessment for and of learning, rests at the heart of what Sperrin Integrated College does and is crucial in helping the staff move the pupils forward in their learning. In evaluating the learning experience, the staff utilise the pupil and parent voice. This ensures the curriculum is fresh and relevant to all the learners' needs and the needs of the economy.

The staff of the school continuously develop their skills to respond to the ever-changing landscape of education. The college provides a stimulating learning environment where academic study and intellectual pursuits are cherished and valued. The College recognises and develops the unique potential of each individual pupil ensuring that stretch and challenge is coupled with the necessary support. This in turn enables the pupils to become questioning, independent, reflective young people who can appropriately use their knowledge to understand, interpret and interact with today's society.

Principal's Forward

The academic year of 2021-22 was another year of unprecedented challenge for all within our school community. In August 2021, as we returned to 'normal' face to face teaching, the school staff endeavoured to create the conditions that would enable our pupils to recover from the significant disruption to their learning as a result of the impact of COVID-19.

At induction and throughout the academic year the areas of focus were on the development of pupil confidence, a positive learning mindset, pupil competency in oracy skills (which had decreased significantly due to remote learning), engagement in school activity and an increase in attendance levels to pre-COVID levels. Strategic planning at all levels took place and actions to address these issues enabled pupils to engage more fully in school life. However, the greatest challenge school staff and pupils faced this year was the almost daily issue of staff and pupil absent. I want to particularly commend Mrs Diane Chambers and Mrs Anne Mc Crystal for their leadership and management of staff cover. Our teaching staff made huge efforts to ensure teaching and learning wasn't impacted too much as they covered for absent colleagues and ensured mechanisms were put in place for pupils to catch-up with missed work.

The other challenge was that our young people had to face high stakes examinations for the first time. It is testament to their character that despite all the disturbance that they all had to endure they still managed to produce the best ever GCSE and A Level results in the school's history:

The overall academic outcomes were as follows: At GCSE, 100% of all pupils achieved grades in the A*-C range in 5 or more GCSE's, with 97% of pupils achieving 7 or more A*-C and 86% of pupils achieved 7 A*-C grades including English and Mathematics. In addition to these wonderful outcomes, I am delighted to report that our much younger pupils also achieved outstanding results in GCSE languages. We had three pupils studying Arabic with 100% pass rate A-C and seven pupils studying Irish (one of which was a Year 8 pupil) with 100% A*-C - 6 out of the 7 outcomes at A grade. At A Level, the pass rate was 100% of pupils achieving 3 or more grades A* to E and 81% of all pupils attaining 3 A*-C grades. Overall, 92% of all entries were A*-C grades, with 70% of all entries at A*-B grade range.

Significantly, students in subject areas including Art & Design, Moving Image Arts and Polish achieved 100% A*-B grades. Additionally, students studying IT and Sport were awarded 100% Distinction* grades.

Standards such as these are only achieved by living out our school motto... **'Pursuing Excellence Together'**. Regardless of ability, ethnicity, or religious background our school staff will endeavour to pursue the highest possible academic outcomes for our all our young people. When we examine outcomes of discernible groups, there is no real difference or large gaps in performance for any young person and this is something we should be very proud of.

Providing such an Excellent educational environment where pupils reach their full potential is the work of our entire school community. All of us, pupils, teachers, support staff, parents, and governors, all working for the common goal, that enables our students to be highly successful.

It is important to acknowledge the work of two senior teachers that have made a very important contribution to the life of the school. Mrs Amanda Monaghan who made a transformative impact on the standards of learning and teaching left Sperrin College in August 2022 and has taken up a post as a School Improvement professional in the Education Authority. Miss Maura Mc Kenna, the school SENCO and member of the mathematics department, will be leaving the school staff at the end of the September 2022 to take up the role of Vice Principal in Integrated College Dungannon. I thank them

both, for their long service and dedication to development of Sperrin College and wish them every success in the future. Two new members of staff have been promoted to the Senior leadership Team ,Miss Judith Giboney has taken up the post of Head of Teaching and Learning and Mrs Michelle Fullen will take up the post of SENCO in September 2022.

Other changes to staffing as we begin our 20th anniversary year are:

Miss Dempster has assumed the role of Head of English taking over from Mrs Sabrina Mulholland. Mrs Anne-Marie Walls has been appointed the Head of Home Economics from November 2022. Also ,Mr Shane Elliot and Miss Eimear Flannagan have taken up a Head of Year role within the College.

In addition, and to address the growth, Mr Michael Shaw , has joined the Technology and Design teacher, Miss Nicola Kelly , English ,Miss Paige Mc Keown Geography ,Miss Stephanie Mc Williams Art and Design, Mrs Sheena Henry English, Miss Jill Frazer Religious Studies ,Miss Niamh Mc Gowan, Mathematics and Miss Megan Murray RS-LLW to our school community.

The staff team staff are truly inspiring , teachers and teaching assistants ,caretaking staff, technical support cleaners and administrative staff all worked tirelessly ,together, to ensure our pupils and their parents have support and quality delivery of curriculum even in the most difficult of times.

I also want to acknowledge the enormous contribution made by the Board of Governors and the Senior Leadership team throughout this very challenging period.

Finally ,I want to thank the parents and pupils who have supportive throughout this very difficult year.
